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

Position of preposition

1) At the beginning.

- To whom are you asking?

2) In the middle.

- This is box of pen.

- This is book of history.

At the end.

- This is the person I followed about.

- This is house I told about.

Among / between

1) Among is used for more than two person.

2) Between is used for two person thing.



- Ex. 1) I found him among the around.
2) Distribute these chocolates among the children.

Between

- 1) Distribute these books between suresh and ramesh
2) What is the difference between monologue and dialogue

With 'difference', 'between' is used.

- If more than two things connected by 'and' then preposition between is used.

Ex. India is situated between China, Pakistan, Bangladesh and Shrilanka.

In / Into

1) Things or places which has boundaries or borders - before it preposition in is used.

Ex. In the house, in the class.

In prison, in news paper in college etc.

2) If the thing or person is entre from outside to inside.

Then preposition 'into' is used.

Ex. 1) The children ran into the house.

2) I jumped into the well.

3) She threw a stone into the pond.

3) Before some time showing words preposition 'in' is used.

Ex. year, months, morning, evening, afternoon, season

2) Before small place 'at' is used and before big place 'in' is used.






